*AFFIRMATION Excerpts from the Westminster Confession, Chapter 2 (1647) J.Y. Lee

(in the sanctuary)

With the Divines of Westminister, we affirm that:

There is but one only, living, and true God, who is infinite in being and perfection, a most pure spirit, invisible, without body, parts, or passions; immutable, immense, eternal, incomprehensible, almighty, most wise, most holy, most free, most absolute; ... most loving, gracious, merciful, long-suffering, abundant in goodness and truth, forgiving iniquity, transgression, and sin; the rewarder of them that diligently seek him; ...

(God) is the fountain of all being, of whom, through whom, and to whom are all things; and hath most sovereign dominion over them, In (God's) sight all things are open and manifest, his knowledge is infinite, infallible, and independent upon the creature, so as nothing is to him contingent, or uncertain. God is most holy in all his counsels, in all his works, and in all his commands. ...
