who love:

All: May they know the deep peace of Christ.
One: Loving God, we hold in your healing presence those facing bereavement:
All: May they know the deep peace of Christ.
One: Loving God, we hold in your healing presence and peace those whose needs are not known to us....And those whose names we do not know, but are known to you....
All: May they know the deep peace of Christ.
One: Together we say: **AMEN**
